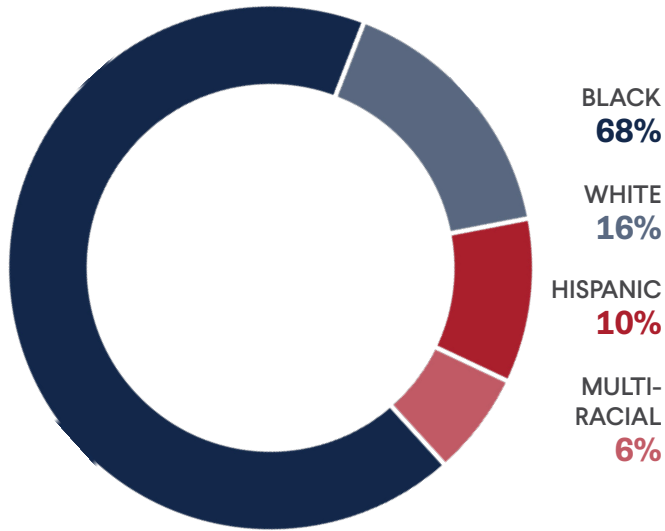

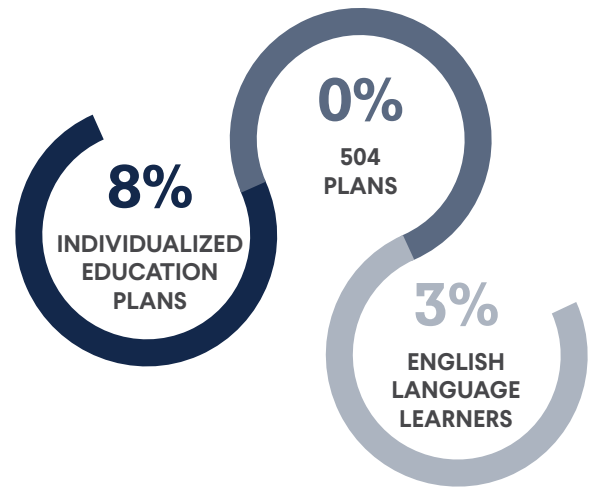

STUDENT DEMOGRAPHICS



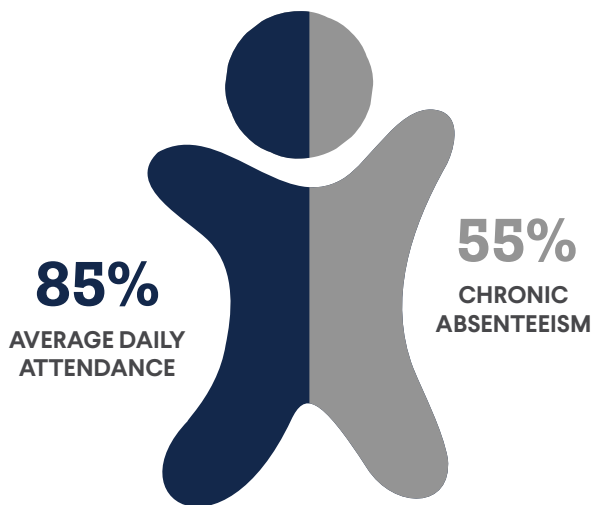

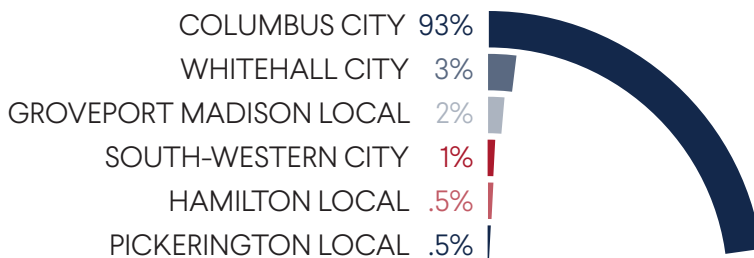

ACADEMIC PROGRESS

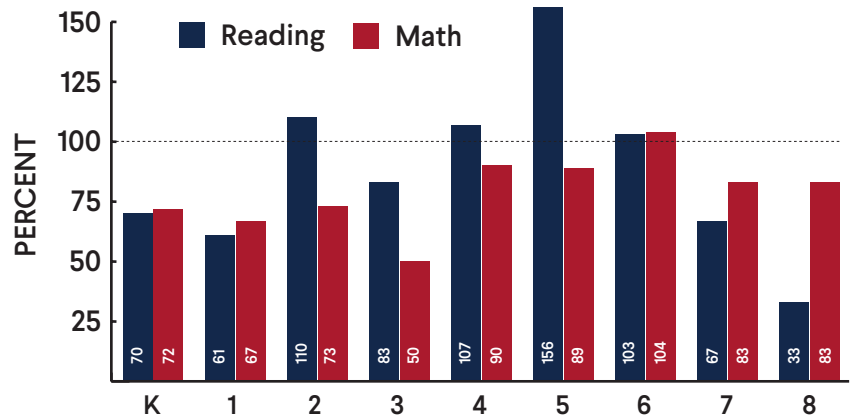
The academic goals of South Columbus Preparatory Academy during the 2021-22 school year were to:

- 75% of students in Grades K-2 achieve one year growth in Reading on i-Ready Assessment
- 70% of students in Grades 3-8 score proficient in Reading on the Ohio State Assessment or show one year growth on i-Ready Assessment
- 80% of students in Grades K-2 achieve one year growth in Math on i-Ready Assessment
- 75% of Grades 3-8 score proficient in Math on the Ohio State Assessment or show one year growth on i-Ready Assessment

Emerging from the pandemic, on average SCPA achieved all academic goals with particular success in Reading for Grades 1, 4, 5 and 6, and in Math for Grade 6, where students exceeded target growth goals.

St. Aloysius, as the sponsor of this school, is legally mandated to provide oversight, monitoring, and technical assistance.
